23. Bhai Gurdas ji wrote down forty Vaars in Punjabi which is known as "Vaaran Bhai Gurdas". Though they are not entered in Sri Guru Granth Sahib ji, these Vaars were designated as the "key" to Sri Guru Granth Sahib ji by Guru Arjan Dev ji.
24. That means all the Pauris in the Vaar are authored by First Guru, Third Guru, Fourth Guru or Fifth Guru.

33. Masand preached the tenets of Sikhi and also collected "Dasoundh money" from Sikh devotees to bring to the Guru Darbar. The Masand system was closed by Guru Gobind Singh ji.
